His wife is very diligent that she finds also additional resources to improve their livelihood. They help each other improve their Chicken Raising and making broomsticks to sell. When we visited them, we saw that even though difficulties arise, he never gave up to grow and develop his Chicken Raising. He is enjoying it and hoping for more progress and opportunities amidst of pandemic. This is the beauty of endurance. When the situation does not work according to our plan, when we have the endurance to face challenges, progress will come out. Development may be little or big, the important is we don't stop.
