PROGRAM ANNUAL REPORT

2021 AND 2022

JANUARY-DECEMBER 2021

1. Technical Training: CHAD continued giving technical support to the Village Health Support Group (VHSG) from different health center partners in the provinces. We successfully facilitated 4 VHSG trainings (2 in Kratie and 2 in Kampong Chhnang Province) where we trained 69 (33F) in Kratie and 43 (28F) in Kampong Chhnang with the help of 6 (2F) Health Center Staff in Kratie and 6 (1F) in Kampong Chhnang. CHAD facilitated VHSG about roles and responsibilities, reviewed their health volunteer activities, and made 3 months' plan. We evaluate and give solutions together with VHSG to effectively help their villages.

2. PARTNERSHIP DEVELOPMENT/NETWORKING:

- Moreover, with the effort of the Health Coordinators, CHAD was able to attend the meeting with the Provincial Health Department at Kampong Chhnang Province to receive health information.
- With the shared the concern about the COVID 19 pandemic situation in our working area. CHAD supported the following:
 - o 10 boxes of masks, 20 liters of alcohol, and 288 pieces of soaps to PHD Kampong Chhnang.
 - o 10 boxes of masks, 20 liters of alcohol, and 192 pieces of soaps to PHD Kratie.
 - O 296 soaps and 96 washable masks from the US to Primary school in Kratie. We are also given an opportunity to facilitate Health Education for Girls' Hygiene among 55 female students, 16 teachers, and 5 Health Center Staff in Kratie. As inclusion, we provide hygiene kits for the monthly period for young ladies attended.
- Lastly, we did the follow-up/visit to Container Clinic which they used for the Quarantine International Check Point Border at Snoul, Kratie.
 - 3. Patien Referal:

JANUARY-DECEMBER 2022

1. Technical Training: CHAD VHSG (Village Health Support Group) review on their roles and responsibilities and monitoring meeting. This year, 93 VHSG volunteers reviewed their roles and responsibilities in their village work. Aside from this, 88 were also trained to do quarter plans and other technical support from the CHAD Team. CHAD was able to provide monitoring meetings with 181 attendance of VHSG. We provided them with session time to help them to assess and evaluate their village health status and help them to have a stronger working relationship with our local Health Center partners. The Local Health Center provided lessons and training for them in different sicknesses according to the season aside from common health problems in the community. VHSG continue to help the Health Center in promoting to have COVID-19 vaccine in their villages and other immunization for children.

2. PARTNERSHIP DEVELOPMENT/NETWORKING

- With the effort of the Health Coordinators, CHAD was able to attend 7 meetings with the Provincial Health Department (TWGH, 2 times face to face and 1 time online with Kratie Provincial Health Department and TWGH 4 times face to face with Kampong Chhnang Provincial Health Department). CHAD staff attended the 2 meetings with Health Action Cambodia Corporation (NGO Network) to strengthen network. Also, we successfully renewed the registration of the GBGM-UMC as NGO to this networked.
- CHAD supports Provincial Health Department with emergency needs, and health campaigns.
- We also provided support for the different needs of the Health Centers partners this year: 1 printer to Kbal Tralanch Health Center, Kratie; 1 printer to Kantout Health Center, Kratie; and 1 whiteboard to Trapang Chan Health Center, Kampong Chhnang
- December 26, 2022, CHAD Team Leader attended as a representative of GBGM at the meeting in Kampong Chhnang for NGO partners. The meeting is called the Civil Society Forum which will create new network for different health agencies and organizations.
- We still continue monitoring the Container Clinic- Quarantine International Check Point Border at Snoul, Kratie as our partnership with the Kratie Provincial Health ministry.
- 3. Patient Referal: CHAD Coordinate patients' referrals to Phnom Penh hospital to receive medical assistance. Coordinated 15 (3F, 12F) referral patients with symptoms of hypertension, diabetes, painful joint, backpain, palpitation, constitution, stomach gas, and nose surgery. 60 % of symptoms falls in hypertension, heart problem, and joint pains
