Chea SivEy is a strong and determined single mother who has faced many hardships. While she was pregnant, her husband left the family, leaving her to raise her child on her own.

Without the opportunity to receive a higher education, finding stable employment has been a constant challenge.

As a single mother, SivEy made the heartbreaking decision to leave her baby in the care of her parents while she searched for work. Determined to build a better future, she reached out to the SHINE Project for support.

Through the SHINE Project, SivEy is gaining practical skills, confidence, and hope to build a sustainable livelihood. We are hopeful that by September, she will be able to start her own small business and provide a brighter future for herself and her child.
